By age 4, she was eager to go there daily before heading to kindergarten. Her grandparents took her to her first "Fly-in Breakfast" at age 10, where she participated in her first of many discovery flights. Over the years, she attended several

Fly-in Breakfasts and had numerous flights, continuing to foster her love of aviation.

In 2017, Kaylee had the opportunity to fly in a powered parachute in Silver Creek, NY, after talking with pilots who offered her the chance. She attended the Air Show in Dunkirk, where she was captivated by the Wing Walker and aspired to become one herself.

Kaylee has developed a fondness for several airplanes, giving them unique names like "Beachy," "Flaggy," "Black Cherry," "Dandelion," "Apache," and "Cappy." Even more, than bestowing special names,



IMPLICIT BIAS WORKSHOPS 2023 - 2024



One of many steps taken to help create a more inclusive and accepting work environment at Aspire of WNY throughout 2023 & 2024 is the new implicit bias workshops that are being offered to employees throughout the agency. These workshops aim to help employees be able to identify and recognize implicit biases and microaggressions. Implicit biases are most often defined as negative feelings or stereotypes that appear automatically and unintentionally. Oftentimes, we are not consciously aware of these, making discussion around this topic crucial to being able to recognize implicit biases as they appear.

The implicit bias workshops are not your typical lecture-style sessions. They are highly interactive, engaging, and centered around group discussions. These workshops provide a safe space for team members to openly discuss diversity and inclusion, fostering a culture of understanding and respect.

"The implicit bias workshops are extremely interactive and create great discussions between employees here at our agency," explains Melissa Roth, Chief Human Resources Officer at Aspire of WNY. "The activities and discussions that take place at the workshops encourage everyone to take a closer look at any biases they may have and really question them."

"The goal of these workshops is to help everyone look deeper beneath the surface," says Renee A. Filip, President & CEO at Aspire of WNY. "Everyone comes from different backgrounds and experiences, so recognizing and talking about implicit bias is essential."

Creating safe spaces for these discussions is vital to our agency's growth. Learning how to recognize implicit biases helps teams collaborate to the best of their ability, and building stronger teams is essential to providing the best care possible to the individuals that our agency supports.


